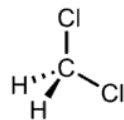

Brazil is the world's largest coffee producer and is becoming a significant player in the specialty coffee industry. Bourbon, Typica, Caturra, and Mundo Novo coffee varieties are grown in the states of Paraná, Espírito Santos, São Paulo, Minas Gerais, and Bahia.

Methylene Chloride (MC) is a chemical used in decaffeinating different types of coffees, coming from all around the world. During the process, the coffee beans are soaked in hot water where the caffeine is extracted and the MC is added to the mixture to bind to the caffeine. It draws 99% of the caffeine from the beans while leaving behind the beans' flavor oils. Our MC decaffeinated Brazilian coffee is bold and flavorful.

CUPPING NOTES: Chocolate, Roasted Hazelnut and Earthy, with a Low Acidity, and a Silky Body.
