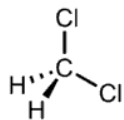

Colombia is the fifth-largest country in Latin America and only one-ninth the size of the U.S., yet it remains the third-largest coffee producer in the world, behind Brazil and Vietnam.

Methylene Chloride (MC) is a chemical used in decaffeinating different types of coffees, coming from all around the world. During the process, the coffee beans are soaked in hot water where the caffeine is extracted and the MC is added to the mixture to bind to the caffeine. It draws 99% of the caffeine from the beans while leaving behind the beans' flavor oils. Our MC decaffeinated Colombian coffee is bold and flavorful.

CUPPING NOTES: Chocolate, Citrus and Sweet, with a Mild Acidity and a Medium Body.
